Mother Suzanne's Comments

DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

As we prepare to enter the month of May Spring has arrived and the school year is coming to its end. May is filled with many special events in both the secular world and the church. There will be school graduations, May 11th is Mother's Day, and Monday, May 26th is Memorial Day.

Since the great Feast Day of Easter, the church has continued its celebration of the Risen Lord with lots of "alleluia's" and with the stories of those who experienced seeing and being with Christ after the resurrection. This period of celebration is sometimes called Eastertide or the Great Fifty Days. This period of time is also called a time of great light which is represented in the church by the presence of the Pascal Candle placed at the left of the altar. It is also during this time, in preparing his followers for his ascension to the Father, that Christ tells them that he will not leave them alone –that the Father would send to them a powerful advocate.

Rogation Sunday, May 25th, when the church has traditionally offered prayer for God's blessing on the fruits of the earth and the labors of humankind. The word rogation is from the Latin *rogare*, to ask. Historically, the Rogation Days are a period of fasting and abstinence, asking God's blessing on the crops, for a bountiful harvest.

The season of Eastertide ends on the Day of Pentecost with the coming of the Holy Spirit, which is celebrated this year on June 8th. On that day the altar hangings and vestments will change from white to red as a symbol of the power and fire of the Holy Spirit. It is also celebrated as the birthday of the church. And there are some very important reasons that Pentecost still matters to us today.
